Brad Turner wins Victor Martyn Lynch-Staunton Award

Jazz musician and composer Brad Turner of Vancouver was one of the 2006 winners of the Canada Council for the Arts' Victor Martyn Lynch-Staunton Award. He is one of Canada's most prolific jazz artists — a trumpeter, pianist, and drummer.

The annual awards, worth \$15,000 each, recognize outstanding midcareer artists in the seven disciplines funded by the Canada Council: music, theatre, dance, visual arts, media arts, writing and publishing and interdisciplinary arts. The prizes were created using funds from a generous bequest made by the late Victor Martyn Lynch-Staunton to the Canada Council.

Turner recently performed at Langley Community Music School for the opening concert of the 2006/2007 season. Playing jazz standards, Turner joined Maestro Bramwell Tovey, music director of the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra and award-winning jazz and classical pianist, VSO concert master Mark Fewer on violin, and bassist David Brown.

Turner has performed and/or recorded with artists Joe Lovano, Kenny Wheeler, Michael Moore, Renee Rosnes, Achim Kaufmann, John Scofield, Ingrid Jensen, Dylan van der Schyff, Mike Murley, Mark Helias, Charles McPherson and Gary Bartz. His jazz groups have opened for McCoy Tyner, Roy Haynes, Wayne Shorter, Clarke Terry and Diana Krall.

As a leader, Turner has released five albums, four with his quartet. The most recent album is *What Is* (2005) and *Question the Answer* (2004), recorded with his piano trio. It was nominated for a 2005 Canadian Urban Music Award and a 2006 Canadian Indie Music Award. In 1997 and again in 1998, Turner won a Juno Award for Best Contemporary Jazz Album, recognizing his work in the internationally-established electric jazz group Metalwood. Turner is the recipient of many national jazz awards, including Jazz Trumpeter of the Year (1999), Jazz Composer of the Year (2000 and 2002) and Musician of the Year (2005).

LCMS Alumni are Leaders in the Arts, Business and Scientific Fields

Many of our past scholarship winners have gone on to have successful careers, and are making their mark in the world of professional musicians. Brad Turner was named Canada's Musician of the Year in 2005. Lila Gailling is concertizing in Europe and on the faculty of the Royal Academy in London. James Hill is making his mark as the world's finest ukulele performer. Others are in major symphony orchestras and teaching at universities. We currently have five alumni on our faculty. Some have chosen different fields – medicine, law, public education, business, journalism, science – Dr. Scott Chapman is a leading

astro-physicist. Our current Board of Directors is headed by business-person and former LCMS student Carolyn Granholm. The ability to play a musical instrument requires a high level of concentration and physical co-ordination as well as self-discipline. Through the study of music, we develop the determination to try difficult things. At LCMS we focus on success and strive to develop students' self-confidence and self-esteem. These characteristics will benefit students in whatever they have chosen in their life's pursuit. We recognize our role in developing the leaders of tomorrow.

Our annual Suzuki Summer Workshop was a wonderful success, with an almost capacity enrolment. Participants came from as far away as Japan and Texas. Our guest master teachers were Daphne Hughes, violin and Merlin Thompson, piano. Both are recognized as leaders in their field throughout Canada and the United States. They were a great inspiration; not only to the students and parents but also to the teachers who came to observe. In addition, Merlin taught a Level Two training course for piano teachers. These training courses are an important part of our summer workshops; offering world class training right at our doorstep.

We were treated to several noontime concerts. Pianist and LCMS alumni Susan Tang gave a thrilling performance. Barbara Nickel gave a reading from her new award-winning book, "Hanna Waters and the Daughter of Johann Sebastian Bach". Fana Soro and members of his dance troupe gave us an exciting show of West African Dance and Drumming.

The students took part in four hours of classes per day. The schedule included master classes, group classes and a choice of Fiddling, Music Sense, Origami, and the always popular West African Dance. Students gave

July 10-14 saw our first week long summer course for the Orff program, taught by Holly Duff and Ross Curran. This was a very popular program. The course was also offered by LCMS at Walnut Grove Community Centre the previous week with the same near capacity registration.

August 3rd treated us to a performance by The Kirby String Quartet, with special guest Heilwig von Konigslow, viola. They presented a wide spectrum of Chamber music from Purcell to Gorecki and concluded with Mendelssohn's Viola Quintet #2. Students participated in daily master classes and coaching as well as orchestral rehearsals. The week culminated in a superb final concert with the various groups performing.

The final week of August saw our Fiddling workshop in full swing and well attended with 20 students playing such popular pieces as "Five Foot Two", which is a piece from the 'Blazin' Strings' CD, now available in the office.

The Chamber Music program is supported by the Amateur Chamber Music Players and the Clinton B. Ford Fund of its ACMP Foundation, an organization that promotes chamber music activities for amateur musicians.

Audition requirements: Bring a piece with a score that you perform well. A jazz standard is preferred but not required.

What to expect at the audition: Sight reading, exercises for range and timbre and you will be expected to perform a piece of your choice.

The LCMS Jazz Choir sings repertoire from Latin to Big Band Jazz. Under the direction of Liana Bob, singers have the opportunity to learn to be a soloist and an ensemble artist, while developing the skills to improvise and work with a rhythm section (piano, bass, and drums).

Elizabeth Bergmann has been on the faculty at Mount Royal College Conservatory in Calgary before joining Langley Community Music School. She has studied at the University of Alberta, University of Toronto, Université de Montreal, Hochschule für Musik und Theater, and at the Banff Centre for the Arts. She holds bachelor, masters, artist and chamber music degrees, with special diplomas in duo piano. In addition to her career as a performer and teacher, she lectures and is a juror for festivals and competitions both nationally and internationally.

The Bergmann Piano Duo has won several international competitions, and has recorded on the Arktos and Naxos labels. They also perform with the Calgary-based contemporary chamber ensemble Land's End, which won both the 2005 and 2006 Western Canadian Music Awards for best classical recording. They are founding members of the International Piano Quartet. The duo served as artistic directors of The Murray Dranoff International Two Piano Competition and Foundation in Miami in 2004-2005.
