Announcing LCMS Resident String Quartet

LCMS is excited to welcome the Pacific Rim String Quartet as resident ensemble for the 2010/11 academic year. The PRSQ (Li-Ling Liao, violin, Ruth Huang, violin, Robin Streb, viola, and Brian Mix, cello) includes two members of LCMS' faculty. Founded in 2007, this group has quickly established itself as a fast rising ensemble, having performed throughout Canada, the US, Europe and Taiwan.

This summer, the Quartet will be on faculty at the *Pulse* Creative and Innovative Chamber Music Program and Festival. In the fall, they will be taking the stage in collaboration with the Bergmann Duo for the second Rose Gellert Hall series concert. In February they will present an all-Beethoven concert for the Concerts Café Classico series, followed by a programme of Shostakovich string quartets in May.

New Music Programs for 2011 School Year Children's Choir

This new LCMS program provides students with the fundamentals of choral singing through exploration of a variety of musical styles and genres.

Percussion Ensemble

This fun, dynamic, and educational class features drumming and percussion styles from around the world. Participants will learn a variety of styles and rhythms such as Brazilian Samba, Salsa patterns from Cuba and Puerto Rico, West African drumming, Indian Bangra, Eastern European Gypsy, and Spanish Flamenco. Students will also play the main keyboard percussion instruments: xylophone, marimba, and orchestral glockenspiel.

Group Guitar

This is a course for students interested in studying guitar in a group setting. Classes will explore a variety of musical styles. Students will be grouped according to age and playing level.

BC Summer Games

When the BC Summer Games come to the Township of Langley this summer, LCMS will have an important role to play. Susan Magnusson, Co-Chair of Ceremonies and member of the TOL BC Summer Games Committee, has been working hard with Ceremonies Co-Chair Karen Pledger, Chair of Marshalling Joel Stobbe and Chair of Entertainment Chris Parsons (alumnus) to put on ceremonies that will be remembered for years to come.

The ceremonies team has already received many accolades for the spectacular torch-lighting that was held this spring at the Langley Events Centre. She will sing "Because I Dream," composed especially for the games by Doug Johnson (member of Loverboy and LCMS Life Member).

not involve whole-brain function; playing a musical instrument does. Music-making stimulates both sides of the brain, integrating pitch, melody/harmony, and rhythm (right

hemisphere) with analysis of changes in frequency and intensity (left side). Students participating in musical instrument studies have

increased capacity to think, reason, and create. They score consistently higher at school, and are most likely to succeed in higher educational endeavors. They are equipped to achieve excellence through their music studies.

A desire to learn is nurtured through the successful accomplishment of skills mastered. The study of music, its order and creativity, enhances the desire to learn in every individual.

Many parents and caregivers feel that life is busy and it's crowding out time for study. Don't lose the momentum gained – consider enrolling your child in one of the new **Creating Music** classes starting this September. These weekly classes are designed for children ages 5 and 6 (Exploring Music) and ages 6 and 7 (Music Adventures). They will continue to build on the musical experiences started in preschool classes - giving your child the opportunity to play and share music.

It may also be time for your child to begin individual instrument study. LCMS is recognized as one of the finest music education centres in the country, with many knowledgeable experienced

New Registration Policies

Monthly Instalments

If you choose to pay tuition by instalments, please take note that tuition for private lessons is now payable in **eight instalments by post-dated cheques**. This is a change from the previous years, where payments were in nine instalments. As always, **fees** are payable in advance of lessons, and all post-dated cheques must be received by the school before the first lesson begins. Due to the staff time involved, for those accounts where full payment or post-dated cheques are not received in advance of the first lesson, a \$10 processing fee per month will be added to the account.

Cancellation Policy

When you register for lessons, there is a commitment between you and the teacher for the full 36 week term. The student has an agreement with the teacher to complete the year. Refunds are only permitted for moving out of the area or for prolonged illness or injury (doctor's note required.) A cancellation fee equivalent to two lessons will apply.


