

Connections between Music-Making, Social Skills & Happier Tots: Evidence from New Research Andrea Unrau June 2, 2013 - 7:30pm

A number of widely-publicized research studies involving school-aged children suggest that music training can positively affect musical, cognitive and language skills. But, as Dr. Shinichi Suzuki famously suggested, can very early musical training have measurable effects on the brain and various skills?

This talk will review the research on musical training and cognitive skills, present the effects of active music participation early in life, and discuss practical implications for parents and teachers.

Andrea Unrau is an educator, researcher and musician currently based in Vancouver, BC. She holds degrees in Psychology, Neuroscience & Behaviour.
