MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL



LCMS celebrates 40 years of educational excellence. Welcome back!

As the doors open on our 40th anniversary as a leading arts

organization offering music education to the community, I look forward to welcoming new and returning families to LCMS. During the year, we will have opportunities to visit the past and celebrate our success through displays of photos and other memorabilia that span four decades. The first opportunity will come on Saturday, September 12 at our open house. I hope to connect with new families and also to reconnect with families that are returning to the School this year. Please check our Calendar and website for updates on special events that will take place during the year as we celebrate this milestone in our history.

I am very pleased to announce that Carolyn Granholm has joined the LCMS team as Assistant Principal. Carolyn has a long history with LCMS, first as a student, and then as a long time member of the Board of Directors. She served as President from 2004-2008. Please take a few minutes to introduce yourself if you haven't yet had the opportunity to meet her.

Please also join me in welcoming new faculty members Mike Allen and Bruce Henczel. Mike Allen will be teaching jazz piano and saxophone, and will lead the jazz ensemble. He is a well known performer, and is also on the faculty of Capilano College. Bruce Henzcel, who holds a Masters in Percussion Performance, will be forming junior and intermediate percussion ensembles featuring drum and percussion styles from around the world.

Also new this year, the Music Intensive Program has been extended to the Intermediate level. Both senior and intermediate level students can take all of their theory and ensemble classes on one day – schedules are posted on the bulletin board with classes beginning the week of September 14. The junior string program is scheduled for Wednesday with Suzuki group performance classes and Fiddling classes running from 3:45 to 6:45. Again, please confirm the correct class and time with your teacher. The MI program allows for convenient scheduling and interaction among students.

I encourage you to take advantage of the enrichment classes. LCMS receives funding from various agencies including the B.C. Arts Council to provide a comprehensive, pre-professional music education.

I am always interested in hearing from you so, as we celebrate our 40th year, I invite you to please take a moment to share with me your comments and suggestions.

SAFETY MESSAGE & SCHOOL REMINDERS

LCMS is committed to the safety of our students and visitors. We need your help to ensure our safety and security measures are adhered to. Please take the time to review the important information below:

- · A fire and safety plan is clearly displayed throughout the School. Please review this plan with your child(ren).
- · Children should not be left at the school until you know your child's teacher is there.
- · Children should not be left unattended in vehicles.
- · Students and members are encouraged NOT to bring valuables in the school, and to have personal insurance coverage where warranted.
- · Report any incidents immediately to the Principal or appropriate staff member.

While we enjoy our location in the park, it is necessary to take special security measures to prevent other users of the park from accessing our facility. The front door is kept locked on weekends, during evening hours, or if there is inadequate presence in the lobby area to monitor people entering. Students and parents should not open the door unless they are sure the person is authorized to enter. If the door is locked, please use the doorbell to notify your teacher upon arrival.

Good Stewards of our Building: We are very fortunate to have such a beautiful facility to use and enjoy for our music classes and lessons. Please take an active role in supervising the lobby and the waiting areas. If you see children playing on the half wall in the lobby, on the steps or with the material posted on the bulletin boards, ask them to stop. Children are not encouraged to ride in the elevator as it is available for those unable to manage the stairs. LCMS would also like to remind parents to accompany small children and toddlers to the washrooms at the school. This will help us ensure our facilities are clean for students and visitors.

Parking: Parking lot safety is another important part of the safety plan at LCMS. School parking is located in the lot to the north of the school. Please do not park in front of the building as it obstructs the view of oncoming traffic. Always drive slowly around the driveway. Do not leave valuables in your car and always lock up. Never leave children unattended in vehicles, even for a short period of time. The disabled parking is ONLY for people who have a designated parking pass and double parking is NOT allowed. LCMS would like to be a good neighbour to those living across the street, and as such, we have agreed not to park on the east side of the road (directly across from the school.) Please note there is no parking by the yellow curb in front of the school.

Exhaust from Running Vehicles – IDLE FREE ZONE:

Please turn off your engines while you wait in the driveway to pick-up a student. Exhaust from running vehicles affects the studios upstairs in the building and makes it unhealthy for students and faculty.


