


Don't miss the opportunity to learn more about LCMS. We hope all members will join us to vote for the 2011/2012 Board of Directors.

TURNING POINT ENSEMBLE

LCMS is thrilled to announce that the Turning Point Ensemble (TPE) will be ensemble in residence for the 2011/12 academic year.

A reading session with the TPE and composer Brad Turner, a Juno award winning Jazz artist and LCMS alumnus kicks off their residency on September 16. At this session, audience members will have a rare opportunity to experience first-hand the dialogue that occurs between professional composer and ensemble as a new

work is developed. This session is part of the Ensemble's project "The Creative and the Classical", that explores the relationship and reciprocal influence between jazz and classical music. The Ensemble's residency continues with the Creating Composers project (see adjacent), and concludes in concert on March 30, 2012, with the final LCMS Rose Gellert Hall season performance. The group will pair works of Igor Stravinsky and Duke Ellington with the premiere performance of a new work by Jazz artist Dave Douglas, as well as the LCMS-commissioned work by Turner.

Vancouver-based TPE was formed in 2002 by its musician members, and its mandate is to increase the appreciation of music composed during the past 100 years, linking the music of earlier times to the music of today through innovative programming and outstanding performance. The Ensemble was recently honoured with the prestigious Rio Tinto Alcan Award for Performing Arts, 2011.

SAFETY MESSAGE & SCHOOL REMINDERS

LCMS is committed to the safety of our students and visitors. We need your help to ensure We are very fortunate to have such a beautiful our safety and security measures are adhered to. Please take the time to review the important information below:

- · A fire and safety plan is clearly displayed throughout the School. Please review this plan with your child(ren).
- Children should not be left at the school until you know your child's teacher is there.
- Children should not be left unattended in vehicles.
- Students and members are encouraged NOT to bring valuables in the school, and to have personal insurance coverage where warranted.
- Report any incidents immediately to the Principal or appropriate staff member.

While we enjoy our location in the park, it is necessary to take special security measures to prevent other users of the park from accessing our facility. The front door is kept locked on weekends, during evening hours, or if there is inadequate presence in the lobby area to monitor people entering. Students and parents should not open the door unless they are sure the person is authorized to enter. If the door is locked, please use the doorbell to notify your teacher upon arrival.

Good Stewards of our Building:

If you see children playing on the half wall in the lobby, on the steps or with the material posted on the bulletin boards, ask them to stop. LCMS would also like to remind parents to accompany small children and toddlers to the washrooms at the school. This will help us ensure our facilities are clean for students and visitors.

Parking:

Parking lot safety is another important part of the safety plan at LCMS. School parking is located in the lot to the north of the school. Please do not park in front of the building as it obstructs the view of oncoming traffic. Always drive slowly around the driveway. Do not leave valuables in your car and always lock up. Never leave children unattended in vehicles, even for a short period of time. The disabled parking is ONLY for people who have a designated parking pass and double parking is NOT allowed. LCMS would like to be a good neighbour to

those living across the street, and as such, we have agreed not to park on the east side of the road (directly across from the school.) Please note there is no parking by the yellow curb in front of the school.

Exhaust from Running Vehicles - IDLE **FREE ZONE:**

Please turn off your engines while you wait in the driveway to pick-up a student. Exhaust from running vehicles affects the studios upstairs in the building and makes it unhealthy for students and faculty.

CHILDREN'S ARTS TAX CREDITS

For 2011 and subsequent years, the federal budget proposes a new non-refundable tax Children's Arts Tax Credit based on eligible expenses of up to \$500 per tax year for the cost of registration or membership of a child in a prescribed program of artistic, cultural, recreational or developmental activity. LCMS will provide receipts for eligible programs.

NEW PROGRAMS

Music Intensive Program Changes

Reminder to anyone interested that a separate registration form is now required for this program. There is no application fee. To be eligible and take advantage of the many benefits of this program, students must be enrolled in weekly private lessons at LCMS, be studying at approximately RCM Grade 9 or above, and be working towards completing their RCM theory requirements.

Percussion Ensemble

This fun, dynamic, and educational class features drumming and percussion styles from around the world. Participants will learn a variety of styles and rhythms such as Brazilian Samba, Salsa patterns from Cuba and Puerto Rico, West African drumming, Indian Bangra, Eastern European Gypsy, and Spanish Flamenco. Students will also play the main keyboard percussion instruments: xylophone, marimba, and orchestral glockenspiel.

Group Guitar

This is a course for students interested in studying guitar in a group setting. Classes explore a variety of musical styles. Students will be grouped by level, depending on enrolment.
